WHAT WE DO

- We teach singing, acting, on camera acting, dancing, & instruments. We instruct about 600 group and private lessons students a month.
- We work with any and all performers that want to join us from extreme special needs to the Broadway bound.
- In a usual year, we produce three awesome community musical theater productions, two fundraiser showcases, eight private lesson recitals, two group class recitals, five summer camp productions and a holiday touring group.
- We do about 200 performances in the community every year including Disneyland Community Arts, retirement centers, church festivals, OC & LA Fair, corporate events, local parades and more.
- We partner with the City of Glendora Parks and Recreation Department as well as local private, public, and charter school districts.
- We also do Princess & Super Hero Parties, host events at the Academy and rent our costumes, sets, and props to other performing arts groups.

OUR PHILOSOPHY

- We are a "no cuts" group where any performer (within the age restrictions placed on us by copyright owners) are invited to perform with us.
- Whether this is your first production or 20th production with us, you will be treated like family with respect, love, and honor.
- We work very hard to make sure every performer has some kind of featured moment or solo. We add mega-mix bows and small cameos to many of our productions in order to feature every single performer.
- We want our performers to try new things and do their best in a safe and supportive performing environment.
- We want every performer to feel like a star. We have spent years fundraising and purchased state of the art sound and lighting equipment so our performers can put on the best shows possible.

COVID-19

- All classes, rehearsals, lessons will be in person at the Academy and on zoom. Some teachers are only teaching from home, but students can come to the Academy for lesson/class time or vice versa.
- Always check in at the front desk for a temperature check. If you are over 100.3 degrees F, you will be asked to sit by the front desk for 15 minutes max to cool down. If temp. does not decrease you will be asked to go home.
- Staff will wear masks and face shields. Per City of Glendora guidelines students and others may or may not wear a mask.
- Please your wash hands for 20 seconds or more every hour.
- Please notify the front desk or Ms. K if you have been exposed to Covid and contacted by a tracer.
 Please do not return to the Academy until you have a negative covid test. If a parent or student is
 feeling sick, please attend rehearsal via zoom.
- Please no sharing food, drinks, pencils, scripts, basically anything.
- We have a quiet room if you need a mental break during rehearsals let the director know.
- Bring water, ice packs, coolie towels, the windows may be open for air circulation and the room will be hotter than normal.

OUR POLICIES

- Regular "school rules" always apply. Wear shoes at all times. Because we are cleaning the floors more, kids are getting splinters through their socks.
- If there is an emergency and we have to leave the Academy, we will meet at the bus plaza across the street.
- If there is a medical emergency, we will contact the parents and medical personnel immediately.
- Always be in groups of three of more. Never be alone for your safety and ours.
- All rehearsals and classes are open to parents, but please do not side-line coach.
- Please do not be more then five minutes late. If you are late picking up your child, please call the front desk at 626-963-1300. A fee may be applied.
- You are responsible for any property damaged by your child.
- TBEPA is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Before you complain, please try volunteering.

OUR EXPECTATIONS

- We expect to put on amazing musical theater productions.
- Performers will come to rehearsals to practice, not to socialize. We are not a babysitting service.
- Performers will practice at home.
- Performers will come prepared with lines and lyrics memorized for the scenes they are working on at rehearsal that day.
- Performers will be team players and positively encourage each other.
- Parents and family will positively encourage all the performers and help with costumes, props, sets
 in whichever way they can.
- We will only compare ourselves to ourselves and not to one another. We will not judge which cast is "better."
- Performers will pick up after themselves, care for all costumes and props, and help keep the rehearsal and performance spaces clean.
- Performers will meet or exceed their financial obligations so the awesomeness can continue.

ZOOM ETIQUETTE

- Please do not film a rehearsal or person (in person or on zoom) without their permission and do not post without their permission.
- Please make sure to mute your mic when you are not talking. Change your screen name to the student's name.
- Please make sure you are dressed appropriately and your background is appropriate for young kids (G rated).
- Students please make sure you have room to dance and have your camera on during all rehearsals and classes unless asked to do differently by the teacher.
- Parents please add TBE Mom or TBE Dad in front of your zoom name if you are watching the zoom so we know who you are. If we don't recognize your name we will remove you from the zoom.

SPECIAL NEEDS

- Allergies please notify us at the start of rehearsals. No peanuts are allowed at the studio. If your child has a life-threatening allergy, they must have an epi pen or medication with them at all times.
- Physical Limitations please notify us at the start of rehearsals. We will make
 modifications as needed. Performers are encouraged to be in all the numbers
 assigned on the rehearsal schedule. However, if it is too demanding physically, the
 performer is welcome to choose only a few numbers to be in.
- Asperger Syndrome or ADD/ADHD please notify us at the start of rehearsals and discuss with the directing staff the best way to make accommodations. If your child has extreme needs, a parent or care taker must be present at all rehearsals and during the performances.
- Blind or Deaf please notify us before rehearsals start so we can make special arrangements with sign language interpreters or provide rehearsal materials in Braille.

- The best way to join us is to just jump on in. You are always invited, welcome, and wanted.

ATTIRE & MAKE-UP

- For regular rehearsals performers must wear attire they can dance in, hair up off the face, dance or athletic shoes. No opened toed shoes or flip flops. "School rules" always apply - no offensive text or images.
- For performances all performers must have undergarments (a tank top and bike shorts) under their costumes and tan or black jazz shoes. Females must have dance tights and bloomers. Females past puberty must wear bras.
- All performers must wear make-up. A quick google search for "children's theater make-up" will bring up video tutorials and tips. All performers must wear a foundation, blush, red lip stick or stain. Please do not share make-up.
- Generally females wear their hair half-up/half-down and curly. Males are clean shaven and hair styled.
- Deodorant and good hygiene are always expected.

COSTUMES

- Generally we will provide all costumes and some wigs. Cast members are expected
 to provide tan jazz shoes, undergarments, wigs or other forms of fake hair, and
 make-up.
- If a performer does not like the costume we provide, they are welcome to purchase or rent one out of their own pocket which meets the director's criteria.
- If a performer damages or loses a costume, prop, or accessory, it is their responsibility to fix or replace it. There are usually sewers backstage for small wear and tear fixes. In some cases, the cast member may be asked to pay a security deposit.
- If cast members do not hang up their costumes or return props to the prop tables, then they will lose the privilege of using it at the next rehearsal or during the next show.
- If a performer is dressed in the wrong costume or is missing a vital part of their costume, they will not be allowed to perform on stage.

REHEARSALS

- We do our best to start and end on time. This year there will be raffle prizes for the performers who are on time. Please do not be more than five minutes late. You are welcome to arrive early, just please do not disturb classes.
- Be sure to sign in at every rehearsal. Usually the sign in table will be on the sidewalk with a volunteer who can answer common questions.
- Performers are welcome to bring food and drinks, but it should not be eaten when performers are working. Water, soda and snacks are for sale at the Academy for \$1. If the cast gets too messy, food privileges during rehearsals will be revoked.
- Please list all conflict dates on your audition form and on the large calendar at the sign in table. If a rehearsal is missed without notice, the performer will be removed from the number, may be removed from a show, or may lose their role.

SHOWS

- Performers arrive to every show with hair and make-up ready.
- If a performer is late to call time without notice, they may be removed from numbers or removed from the show that day.
- All performers must help load the show in and out of the theater. No one is excused from the strike after the show until the director notifies the cast.
- Parents and other volunteers will be assigned to duties (snack bar, supervision, etc.). Please do your best to help where assigned.
- Not all parents can be backstage during a show. Usually parents with children ages 4-5 are given priority. If your child needs help dressing or has special needs, please let us know at the beginning of the rehearsals how to best assist them.

BEHAVIOR CONSEQUENCES

- Each cast will decide the consequences for talking during rehearsal at the start of the practices. Usually if the director has to ask more then three times for the cast to be quiet, then the entire cast will do 20 sit-up, push-ups, or jumping-jacks.
- For other behavioral problems, the cast member will be given a verbal warning by a director.
- If the problem continues, the cast member will be given a time-out.
- If the problem continues, a parent will be notified.
- If the problem continues, the cast member will be cut from a number.
- If the problem continues, the cast member will be cut from a show.
- If the problem continues, the cast member will be dismissed from the production.
